Special interior features of this house include: four panel doors, grained on the first floor; two stoves, one a Moore's Seventeen Console stove, the other, an Acme Oak Leaf from Newark stove works of Chicago; and a closed, fourteen tread stairway.

A barn is also located on the property in addition to a springhouse, butter shed and a few other outbuildings.

## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame stud constructed farmhouse is situated on a bank in a hilly wooded area on Frostburg Water Co. Road, approximately 3/4 miles southwest of the Garrett County-Somerset County line. The house faces east. It is a two story, three bay by two bay gable roof structure with a two story ell. A single story shed addition is located in the rear off the north elevation of the ell and houses an entrance. A porch, supported by wooden posts with jig-sawn balustrades is located on the north elevation to the rear of the ell. The central facade entrance has a five panel door and a transom and is covered by a bracketed door hood. Entrances also are located at the porch, the shed addition and at the rear west elevation.

The house has a central brick chimney. Two over two sash windows light the house. Small two pane windows are located in the gable ends of both the main block and the ell. The windows are framed by plain flat boards. The house rests on a stone foundation, with a cellar entrance on the south elevation. The house is covered with German siding with corner-boards.

Special interior features of this house include: four panel doors, grained on the first floor; two stoves, one a Moore's Seventeen Console stove, the other, an Acme Oak Leaf from Newark stove works of Chicago; and a closed, fourteen tread stairway.

A barn is also located on the property in addition to a springhouse, butter shed and a few other outbuildings.

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The house was built by farmer, John Meese in the year 1900.


