## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Anthony Drees Farm is located on the eastern slope of Little Savage Mtn., just south of the Pennsylvania border.

The house is a 2-story frame, 3 bay by 1 bay dwelling based on the ell-plan. It rests on a stone foundation, has aluminum siding (original siding is not detectable), and has a gable roof covered with asphalt shingles.

The facade faces east and has a central entrance. This entrance is located where the gable end elevation of the main block joins with the ell elevation and may actually be a recent entrance alteration. A 1-story shed porch with a cement block foundation runs across the facade.

A 1-story enclosed shed addition is located on the north elevation.

The south elevation has a centrally-placed exterior brick chimney.

All windows are 1/1 aluminum sash.

A small frame bank barn lies NW of the house.

An Allegany County boundary stone from the Chisholm survey is located in the woods, approx. 1000ft. SW of the house on the east slope of Little Savage Mtn.

The marker is sandstone and has a gothic A incised on the east face.

The Anthony Drees farm house is representative of a common house form found in this section of Maryland-the 2-story, 3 bay by 1 bay, ell-plan framehouse.

According to Stanley Drees, the son of Anthony Drees, his father bought the farm in the 1920's from a Howard Baker. Oral tradition dates the construction of the house to just after the Civil War.


