Name of Property: Little Savage Mountain House

Location: U.S. Route 40 and MD 546, Frostburg, MD

The Little Savage Mountain House was located on Old Route 40 near the intersection of 40 with Finzel Road. The house was three bays wide and one bay deep, with a rear ell and a shed roof addition on the east side of the ell. The Little Savage Mountain House was two stories, with a side-gabled roof, which was pierced by a cinder-block chimney on the east elevation. The roof was covered with corrugated metal, and the walls were covered with asphalt shingles simulated to look like bricks. The building sat atop a stone foundation, with access to a cellar on the east side.

The house was destroyed sometime after 2010. Aerial images of the area captured in that year show the ell-shaped dwelling, but by 2011 it was no longer extant.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This vertical plank constructed, farmhouse is situated at the intersection of Old Route 40 and Rt. 546 and faces south. It is a three by one bay, two story structure with a gable roof, and an ell addition. A single story shed addition extends from the east side of the ell. A facade porch, supported by six plain square wooden posts, covers the three bays. A porch also runs across the back, north elevation, to the shed addition.

A cinderblock gable end chimney is located on the west elevation. Two over two sash windows light the first story with single pane windows on the second story. The house rests on a stone foundation with a cellar entrance on the east elevation. Aside from the central facade entrance, there is an entrance on the rear shed addition. The house is covered with asphalt shingles. The roofs of both the main structure and the shed addition are covered with corrugated metal. The roof of the ell is covered with asphalt shingles.


