DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ray E. Miller Farm lies in open hilly terrain. The house and barn are based on a linear plan facing SE and are set into a slope.

The house is a 3-bay by 2-bay, 2-story frame dwelling with a central entrance. It rests on a roughly squared stone and mortar foundation and presently has asbestos shingle siding; original siding is weatherboard. The gable roof has asphalt shingles.

The windows are 1/1 sash with plain board surrounds. There are 2 single pane windows in the attic story of both gable ends and a large picture window at the NE end of the facade.

A 1-story facade porch is approached at the SW side by 10 steps and has a hip roof supported by 4 square wooden columns and a solid paneled balustrade. Under the facade porch is a full-story basement with a double entrance.

There is a small hipped roof porch covering an entrance on the SW gable end.

There are 2 interior gable end brick chimneys.

The frame bank barn, silo, and small hipped roof outbuilding lie SW of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

This farm was purchased in the 1890s for approximately \$2000 by the present occupant's (Mrs. Miller) mother, Mrs. Louis Durr. Mrs. Durr purchased it from the Johnson estate, part of the vast land holdings that once belonged to Thomas Johnson, Maryland's first governor. Mrs. Durr came from Somerset County, PA.


