DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated within the community of Finzel on the western slope of Little Savage Mountain and faces south. It is a three bay by one bay, two story structure with a gable roof. A single story one bay gable roof addition extends from the east end of the facade. A shed porch runs along the rest of the facade and wraps around the west elevation of the facade addition. A small shed addition appears on the rear elevation of the house.

An exterior brick end chimney is located on the west elevation of the house. One over one sash windows light the house. Small two pane windows are located on the rear elevation (one on the first story and one on the second) and one on the east elevation of the addition. The house is covered with German siding (except on the front second story facade) with cornerboards framing it. The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house rests on a stone foundation.

A springhouse with an overhang and a small frame barn are located at this site.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and front kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The present owner, Sam Eisler, bought this farm from a Joe McKenzie in 1926. The McKenzie's obtained this farm in the late 19th century from the descendents of Thomas Johnson, Maryland's 1st. governor. Johnson owned vast tracts of land in Garrett County.


