DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The George S. Warnick Farm is situated on the western slope of Big Savage Mountain, west of Barton and consists of a nondescript frame house built in 1911, a double-pen, saddle-notched, unhewn log barn, built in 1875, and nine frame outbuildings, built in the 1930's.

The frame house is a 1-story, gable roofed dwelling constructed on the T-plan with shed additions.

The saddle-notched log barn was constructed in c.1895. It is covered with vertical boards and rests on a low, dry, flat stone foundation. A new roof was added in the 1950s.

Most of the outbuildings were constructed in the 1930s and include a machine shed, granary, corn crib, chicken shed, a small barn, and an additional machine shed. A frame springhouse, constructed in 1916, stands on the site of an earlier log springhouse. A frame washhouse, constructed in 1946, stands on the site of a log house, built by Silas Warnick, the original settler of this site. (Stanley Fazenbaker, interview, 10-28-1980). A cornerstone of this house lies just southwest of the washhouse. A frame hay barn, built in 1959, is located on the farm.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This site is significant for the number of outbuildings associated with it, and the connection with Silas Warnick, an early settler in this region.

Silas Warnick was the great-grandfather of the present occupant, Stanley Fazenbaker. George S. Warnick, born in 1859, was the son of Silas. He bought the farm in 1883 from a family that had inherited the farm after Silas' death. The barn was constructed by George in 1895. The present house was constructed in 1911 by George Warnick, Stanley and Alvin Fazenbaker.


