## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Carder Farm is located on a rise above Old Westernport Road. To the SW is a strip mining operation, and farther to the W is a portion of the Savage River State Forest.

The farm consists of a house, barn, and two outbuildings. The house is a square two-story dwelling with a pyramidal roof and an irregular facade. The facade points E. A one-story, hipped-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and the N elevation.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with green asbestos shingles. The windows are two over two sash with plain mitred surrounds. On the first floor of the N elevation, the walls are covered with green German siding. On this elevation are two doors and a window. The easternmost door is blocked, while the Westernmost door is functional. The window is set close to the W door. The window and doors have simple cornices and plain board surrounds. The side door and facade door each have two-paned transoms. The facade door is centrally placed and to the N is a two-story, three-sided bay. The bay has windows in all faces except the first floor face nearest the facade door.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. Over the bay on the facade and at the E end of the S elevation, the roof exhibits gable ends. The attic stories of the gable ends are filled with fishscale shingles and the roof cornice returns on each gable end. On the facade, the gable end on the three-sided bay creates an overhang at each side which is filled with jigsawn brackets with drop spindles.

The house has two interior brick stove chimneys: one north and one south of the peak of the pyramid roof.

The porch roof is supported by ten turned posts featuring jigsawn brackets. The facade also features a jigsawn balustrade.

The interior of the house is unknown. The facade door exhibits stamped, decorated butt hinges.

North of the main house is a small building possibly at one time used as a shop or springhouse (#1). The building stands one story tall and has a gable roof. The entrance door is at the center of the W elevation. All windows have four lights. The walls are covered with grey asbestos shingles. At the N gable end is a interior metal stove pipe. To the W of the entrance is a small spring.

South of the main house are a frame bank barn and another small outbuilding. The barn rests on a stone foundation and is covered with red-painted vertical boards. The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The overhang of the barn is on its E elevation. The N elevation is decorated with three blank window surrounds, circles and a star in the gable, all painted white.



The last small outbuilding (#2) is located between the barn and the house. It is a one-story gable-roofed building resting on a dry stone foundation. The walls are covered with red-painted board and batten siding and the roof is probably used for storage.
