DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Borderside stands on the northerly side of the Oakland-Westernport Road, Maryland Route 135, at the intersections of Branch and Lone Avenues in Bloomington, in southeastern Garrett County.

The house is a late nineteenth century Italianate style brick structure that consists of a two and a half story rectangular block with a three story tower centered on the principal facade (easterly side), a multi-level wing on the south side, and a one story porch across the length of the north side.

The gently sloping hip roofs are covered with tin sheeting and supported by sets of double brackets. The tower has a pronounced bell-curve Mansard roof. The brick is laid in common bond with six rows of stretchers and one row of headers. The foundation is made of cut stone. A one story porch appears to have been removed from the back or west side.

The principal facade of the main block is symmetrical with a semi-octagonal projection with three windows on either side of the tower with two windows above. Each side of the tower has a recessed area in which the windows are placed. Most of the windows have brick flat arches except for the first floor windows of the back or west side which have bracketed lintels. The windows have double-hung wooden sashes with four over four lights, except for the principal windows of the project which have four over six lights.

The bulk of the exterior decoration is found on the tower. The entranceway has a semi-circular fan light with one pane and a keystone in the framing with a heavy entablature supported by "leafy" brackets above. Marks on the wall indicate that a railing ran around the entablature at one time. The entranceway is topped by a pair of hooded windows and a round headed recessed window in the third story. The sides of the tower have rectangular windows on the first two stories and round windows on the third. The present front door was added within the past decade, however, the original double doors are said to be in storage.

The interior, which is in good condition, has heavy natural finished trim characteristic of the style. The conversion for office was done with some care to avoid damage to the structure.

The building is structurally sound and sets on a tract of about 4.77 acres. It retains enough of its original fabric to make preservation and/or restoration feasible and hopeful.



STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE


Borderside is by far one of the most formidable nineteenth century residences in Garrett County. Erected following the Civil War, the house is representative of the Italian Villa style, notably the square tower, the asymmetrically arranged rectilinear blocks, the smooth and uniform exterior walls, and the bracketed hip roof with a slight pitch. (Whiffen, p. 69). It also has the characteristic bay windows and verandas, one of which was removed in recent years. Borderside is an unusual building for nineteenth century Garrett County in that it is constructed of brick, a material not used that much in house construction. The usual building material was wood and several good examples of Italianate style frame dwelling can be found throughout the county. Brick, however, seems to have been primarily limited to public buildings such as the courthouse and school buildings.

Borderside, also commonly known as Brydon Mansion, was the residence of William A. Brydon. It was built about 1870 when Western Maryland was coming into prominence because of its vast supply of natural resources. Brydon was an entrepreneur dealing in coal and lumber. He was a member of the Maryland House of Delegates in 1867 and a representative of Allegany County in the years before Garrett County was formed. Brydon, a member of the first Board of School Commissioners of Garrett County, made a second, but unsuccessful, bid for the House of Delegates in 1891.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

Although difficult to approach closely for a better assessment, this large brick structure would seem to have been the finest, or most important, house in Bloomington, and was perhaps the 'mill owner's house'.

Architecturally, the house represents a later [and somewhat simplified version] of the Italian Villa style -- notably the central tower, and the layout of the plan. There is little decoration and it is primarily lavished on the doorways -- brackets, etc. -- and is High Victorian Italianate, although the decoration is more restrained than that usually associated with this style. A rural version of the late Italian villa and not unlike the work of the Philadelphia architect and author, Samuel Sloan. [Samuel Sloan, 1815-84, THE MODEL ARCHITECT, 1852.]

This house is a large brick structure (with wing) of 2 storeys, plus central tower, which is 3 storeys. The tower projects from the ctr. of the main block and is topped by a very pronounced bell curved mansard roof; this and all roof is red painted sheet metal. The ~~entire~~ main block has a porch on the north side (one story in height), while there is a large 2 story (tho' not as tall as main block) brick addition on south side - there is a small, one storey addition extending to the south of this wing. The gently sloped roofs are supported by paired brackets, as is are door lintels. The central tower receives the bulk of the decorative treatment having heavy door entablature topped w/ semi circular single light - fan; the cornice of the door forms small balcony for long double window above (this has a bracketed cornice), + there is a tall accented rounded headed window at 2nd floor height. Also at this height side of tower has round *oculus* windows. Ground floor windows of main block are semi-octagonal projections (these are $\frac{1}{6}$, but most windows are $\frac{1}{4}$)




