DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lucretia Umbel House is a 2-story, ell-plan, gable-roofed dwelling with a symmetrical, three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points SW. A one-story shed porch runs the length of the facade. wraps around the S corner and runs the length of the SE elevation.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with German siding. All windows are 2/2 and have pedimented window heads. Attic windows in the SE, NE & NW elevations are one-pane lancets. An addition on the NW elevation is covered with aluminum siding and has modern sliding windows. The facade door is a single, 4-paneled door with a single-paned rectangular transom and 2-paneled side lights. The roof is standing seam metal.

The house has one interior brick flue at the ridge line of the ell. The porch is supported by turned posts. The house is accompanied by a frame barn and several frame outbuildings.


