DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Meg Stevens House is a two-story, T-plan, gable-roofed dwelling with a symmetrical, 3-bay, center-door facade. The facade, facing the road, points NW. The ground slopes away from the road, making a full basement story visible at the rear (SE). A raised, shed-roofed porch fills in the NE side of the T at the first floor level, and a one-story, hipped roof porch adorns the facade.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with grey asphalt siding. The windows have cornices and plain board surrounds. The second floor facade windows have 12x1 sash, and the second floor window on the NE elevation of the T has 8x1 sash. All other windows are 1x1 sash.

The facade roof has a center cross gable with a 1x1 window.

The roof cornice runs the length of the facade and returns on the gable ends. The roof covering is slate.

The house has three brick interior end chimneys at the NE, SW, and SE gable ends. The facade porch roof is supported by four turned columns. There is a frame outbuilding at the rear (SE) of the house.

Approximately 2/10 mile NE along Frazee Ridge Road from the house is a small cemetery, comprising approximately seven graves. The earliest stone, that of Perry Frazee, gives his dates 1842-1865. Frazee and Fike are the only two names represented.


