DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Robert W. Lewis House is placed on a hill above Old Morgantown Road, facing north. The ground slopes up steeply behind the house.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling, measuring three bays across the front and two bays on the sides. A one-story shed addition projects from the rear (S) elevation, and a three-bay, one-story porch adorns the facade.

The house rests on a low stone foundation and is covered with red, brick-patterned asphalt siding. The windows are two over two sash and have cornices and plain board surrounds. The central facade door has a single-paned transom and also has a cornice and plain board surround. All windows and door trim and cornerboards are painted white.

The roof is covered with standing seam metal. There are two interior stove chimneys, at either end of the main block.

At the rear elevation, on the SE corner, is a small service porch with a shed roof, which is part of the rear shed addition. The roof is supported by square posts, painted white. On the facade, the hipped-roof porch is supported by four turned posts which sport jigsawn quarter-round brackets and drop spindles. The porch eave is also trimmed with drop spindles. The balustrade is jigsawn and the roof is covered with tarpaper. The porch posts and balustrade are painted white, and the brackets and drop spindles are painted green.

At the bottom of the hill, near the road, is a low concrete retaining wall. Several feet to the E of the house, at the level of the road, is a small gable-roofed garage facing N. The garage rests on a brick foundation and is constructed of unpainted German siding. The rear of the garage has been built into the side of the hill. There is evidence on the E elevation of a previous structure in the remains of a stone wall or foundation. The roof of the present structure is of corrugated metal.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block with a symmetrical three bay facade, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The porch trim may have been manufactured at one of the many local sawmills.


