## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This one-story, three-bay building stands on one corner of the crossroads called Sand Spring. A section with a lower roofline covers the south end of the structure. The present entrance occupies the southernmost bay of the west elevation. 6/6 windows light the building.

A central brick stove-flue chimney heats the structure. Asphalt shingles cover the roof, and insul-brick covers the walls. The school stands on a cut stone block foundation.

Although the main wall construction was not visible, the thinness of the walls suggests the locally popular vertical plank construction. A layer of lapped weatherboards survives under the insul-brick. Horizontal planks cover the interior. Architraves feature quirk-ogee moldings flanking a central astragal.


