The Edgar S. Bartholomew House is situated on a slope several yards north of Blooming Rose Road. The ground slopes steeply down from north to south, making the house's foundation more visible on the south elevation.

The house is a gable-roofed, rectangular dwelling, measuring three bays across the facade (S elevation) and one bay on the sides. A one-story porch runs the length of the north elevation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Edgar S. Bartholomew House is situated on a slope several yards N of Blooming Rose Rd. The ground slopes steeply down from N to S, making the house's foundation more visible on the S elevation.

The house is a gable-roofed, rectangular dwelling, measuring three bays across the facade (S elevation) and one bay on the sides. A one-story porch runs the length of the N elevation.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation, painted white. The walls are covered with brown wood shingles over German siding. The German siding is still visible under the porch on the N elevation. The windows are two over two sash, with plain board surrounds. The second-floor windows on the N elevation have pedimented window heads; all other windows have simple cornices. All trim has been painted white. The entrance door has been boarded up, but exhibits a two-paned transom. The N elevation exhibits two doors, one at either end of the first floor. The roof is covered with standing seam metal.

The house has one central brick stove chimney. A shed-roofed porch shelters the first floor of the N elevation. The roof is supported by four turned posts. On the facade (S elevation), the placement of the entrance door is such that a porch or a set of steps must at one time have been attached; however, any evidence of such a porch or steps has been obscured.

Several small frame outbuildings are scattered about the property. The property is unoccupied.

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block measuring three bays by one bay, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


