This one-story frame house measures four bays long. The building's northwest facade is covered by a porch. This side's entrance appears in the third bay from the left. A brick stove flue chimney heats the center of the house.

The second bay on the facade and the central of three bays on the rear are lit by 3/1 windows. 4/4 windows light the other bays.

The cellar's southeast and northeast sides are exposed by the sloping hill. The foundation is of cut stone block filled with sections of concrete block. Standing seam metal covers the roof. Insul-brick sheathes the walls.

Two frame bank barns and several sheds are located north of the house. A c. 1940 brick bungalow is also located to the north.
