DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This well-built two-story frame farmhouse is built in an "L" plan. The three-bay south-facing facade is covered by a porch which continues across the west side of the building. Another porch crosses the east side of the kitchen.

Central doors appear on the facade as well as on either side of the three-bay kitchen. A four-panel door leads into the main house at its north end. 2/2 windows light the house. A central brick stove-flue chimney heats the building.

Tarpaper covers the roof. German siding of varying widths is applied with wire nails to the walls. The gables are lit by pointed arch single-pane windows and covered with octagonal shingles. Architrave moldings consist of half-round profiles flanking either side of a central concave section. Porch posts are chamfered. The house stands on a stone foundation.

A small stone-enclosed spring emerges northwest of the house.
