Funny Farm is located a 1/4 miles west of Friendsville on the south side of Route 42. Consisting of a dwelling, cemetery, and three sheds, the complex dates to the second quarter of the twentieth century. The barn and corn crib no longer exist on the property. The dwelling is a one story multi-gable frame bungalow with 3/1 windows and concrete foundation. Although well-maintained, the dwelling is a common property type and does not exhibit any distinctive characteristics. With the loss of the barn and corn crib, the property has reduced integrity as a rural agricultural complex. Neither the house or the cemetery will be directly impacted by the new construction. In my opinion, Funny Farm does not qualify for the National Register under criterion a, b or c, based on the limited information




