DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The S. M. Moser House is located on the SW side of U.S. Route 40 between State Line Methodist Church (G-II-B-003) and the Pennsylvania border. The ground slopes down from the road, making the foundation of the house more visible on the rear elevation.

The house is a two-story, Ell-plan, gable-roofed dwelling measuring three bays across the facade. The facade points NE. The side elevations measure one bay across, while the Ell measures one bay by one bay.

The house rests on a low stone foundation and is covered with grey brick-patterned asphalt siding. The windows are two over two sash with simple cornices and plain board surrounds. On the first floor of the facade, at the E end is a bay window. At the W end is a wide sash window, with one narrow upper pane over a large lower one. The facade roof exhibits a central cross gable containing a one-pane attic window. The central facade door has a glass panel set into the door and a transom. The roof is covered with corrugated metal.

There is one exterior brick stove chimney on the SE elevation at the S end of the main block. The house has two porches. There is a one-story shed porch on the facade, its roof supported by turned posts, and an enclosed one-story, shed-roofed sunporch which fills the Ell on the NW and SW elevations.

The interior has a central stairhall, but is otherwise unknown.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The owner speculates that the house was built circa 1910, when the Kendall Lumber Company cut out all the timber in the area.

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


