**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

The Schutte House is located to the SE of St. John's English Lutheran Church (G-II-B-076) in the Cove, approx. three and 1/2 miles NE of Accident. The land slopes down behind the house and the house commands a view of rolling hills and farmland.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling measuring three bays on the facade. The facade points NE. The side elevations measure two bays wide.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with white aluminum siding. The two facade first-floor windows are single-sash, divided into three panes: a narrow horizontal at the top, and two narrow verticals at the bottom. On the bottom rails are handles. The other windows are all one over one sash, and all window surrounds were removed with the addition of the aluminum siding. The cross gable roof is covered with diamond-shaped asphalt shingles.

The house has one interior stove chimney at the ridgeline NW of center. A shed-roofed, one-story porch runs the length of the facade and halfway across the SE gable end. The S half of the SE gable end has been covered with a one-story, shed-roofed addition. The facade porch roof is supported by six wooden columns and is covered with asphalt shingles. A balustrade of plain square posts runs between the columns and has a central entrance.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is the parsonage for St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church (LCMS) G-II-B-078. According to an article in the Glades Star, a collection was taken up to finance its construction in 1908. The house is supposed to be similar to the Zion Lutheran Church parsonage at Accident. The house's design is somewhat formal and impressive, as befits the home of a Lutheran minister, surely one of the most important people in the community at that time.

The house was thoroughly renovated in 1962.


