## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The William Beitzell Farm is located on Everly Road, approximately 1.5 miles N of Bear Creek. The main house stands on the west side of the road and the barn and other farm buildings stand on the east side. The farm has a view to the east of rolling farmland.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points east. A one-story, shed-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and the north gable end.

The house rests on a roughly squared, coursed stone foundation. The walls are covered with red diamond asphalt shingle, except under the facade porch, where the walls are covered with lapped weatherboarding. All windows are two over two sash except for the first floor facade windows, which are six over six sash. All windows have simple cornices and plain board surrounds, except the first floor facade windows, which have moulded, mitred surrounds. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The house has one interior brick stove chimney at the ridgeline, slightly N of center. The porch roof is supported by square wooden columns with simple bases and capitals. The west end of the porch on the north gable end has been enclosed to form a small storage room. The east elevation of this room has a door, the north elevation a two over two sash window.

The interior of the house is unknown. The barn rests on a coursed stone foundation and is covered with vertical boards. Its roof is corrugated metal. The bank entrance faces NE.

North of the barn are a garage and several frame outbuildings. Two frame outbuildings lie W & S of the house. A small privy stands immediately SW of the barn.




