The store is a two-story, gable-roofed structure with an asymmetrical five-bay facade. The facade points south. A one-story, hipped-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and extends beyond the east gable end.

The Engle Mill Store is located on Fish Hatchery Road, just opposite the entrance to the State Trout Hatchery. Bear Creek runs just north of the house.

The store is a two-story, gable-roofed structure with an asymmetrical five-bay facade. The facade points south. A one-story, hipped-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and extends beyond the east gable end.

The store rests on a low coursed stone foundation and is covered with asphalt shingles. On the facade, the area under the porch is covered with white German siding. The windows are two over two sash, with plain board surrounds. The first floor facade has two doors, one at the east end and one between two windows near the west end. An additional window is just west of the eastern door.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has two brick stove chimneys: one exterior chimney on the east gable end, and one interior chimney just west of center. The porch roof is covered with corrugated metal and is supported by square wooden columns and a solid balustrade.

The interior is divided into two parts by a central staircase offset to the east. West of the staircase was the portion used as a store; east of the stair was living quarters for the proprietors. The entire store is now being used as living quarters.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Engle Mill Store was built as a way side inn, a store, and a dwelling house for the proprietors at a time when the road that ran by it, the Accident-Bitteringer Highway, was a main thoroughfare. . The location was probably due to the fact that Engle Mill had been built there in 1835, at a time when the area harbored a settlement of about seven families. Until 1865, when Kaese Mill was built, Engle Mill was one of only two gristmills in the area.


