DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Collier House is located on Collier Road, near Route 219S. The house has a view to the north of Route 219 and Northern High School.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a symmetrical four-bay facade. The facade points east. A one-story, one-bay, gable-roofed porch covers the facade door. A one-story, gable-roofed porch covers the west elevation and a one-story addition covers the north elevation of the Ell. A two-story, three-sided bay is attached to the south gable end.

The house rests on a coursed stone foundation which has been covered with pressed tin. The house was built in several sections, some of vertical planks and some of studs. The walls are covered with brick patterned asphalt siding, except for the gables, which are covered with white weatherboarding. The sash windows are two over two with mitred surrounds. In the attic stories of the north and south gable ends are small round-headed windows with a traceried pattern. The facade door has a four-paned transom and four-paned sidelights.

The roof has a cross gable on the facade and is covered with standing seam metal. The house has four stone chimneys: an interior brick chimney just north of the cross gable on the main block, a cinderblock chimney at the inner corner where the ell meets the main block, an interior brick chimney at the northwest corner of the one-story addition on the north elevation of the ell.

The interior of the house has a central staircase, but is otherwise unknown.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to the family, the original portion of the house was built by M. W. Weller, great-grandfather of the present owner. Weller was a German immigrant who settled first at Keyser's Ridge and then moved to this property. The house has had many additions over the years, and is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


