DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gerald Glass Hunting Lodge is located several feet from Sam Friend Road on a tract of cleared ground. To the NE and NW of the house lie forest; to the SW lies a small cornfield with forest beyond.

The lodge is a two-story ell-plan dwelling with a gable roof. The facade points SE and the ell extends from the NW elevation. The main block measures two bays by one bay and the ell measures one bay each on the NE and NW elevations and two bays on the SW.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and the main block is constructed of logs. The logs are square-notched and have cement daubing. On the facade and NE elevations the logs have been painted black and the daubing painted white. On the NW elevation, the visible portion of the wall has been left its natural color. The second floor of the facade, the gable of the NE elevation, the SW elevation, and the ell are all covered with dark brown brick-patterned asphalt siding. The roof is covered with grey and white striped asphalt shingles.

The windows are predominantly modern two over two sash with plain mitred surrounds; however, there is a six over six window, a two over one window and a one over one window in the house.

The house has no chimneys. A one-story, hipped-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and the SW elevation. Its roof is covered with grey and white asphalt shingles and is supported by round posts. The interior of the house is unknown.


