This farm comprises a two-story, ell-plan frame house, a frame bank barn, and several outbuilding.

Dave Wiltrout bought this farm from John Bowser in 1902. Shortly, thereafter he built the present dwelling to replace the small vertical plank house that Bowser had built. A log house reportedly predated Bowser's structure. The barn is said to date from c. 1870

The building sequence of these structures exhibits the three most common forms of wood construction in Garrett County-log, vertical plank, and balloon frame. This sequence also appears at the J. Bunnell Friend Farm. (G-III-A-049).

The historical character of this farm is enhanced by the use of non-electric appliances and plumbing fixtures.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Dave Wiltrout Farm is located on the east side of Pig's Ear Road approximately 1.5 miles south of Strawn. The farm is set back from the road .2 mile and includes a dwelling, a shed, a privy, a bank barn, and a hog pen.

The house is a two story, gable-roofed building of balloon frame construction. Its basic configuration is an ell-plan that consists of a three bay by one bay main block and a one bay by one bay rear wing. A shed-roofed porch supported by chamfered posts extends across the facade, continues around to the northeast endwall and the rear wall, and terminates on the northeast side of the rear wing. The facade has a symmetrical three bay, center door arrangement. Its door and the rear door are both topped by single-pane transom lights. All windows are one over one sash with plain board surrounds and molded drip boards. Also, each of the three gables is lit by a small diamond window with plain board surrounds and bullseye cornerblocks. The exterior walls have been covered with brick-patterned asphalt siding but the roof retains its original stamped tin shingles. An interior brick chimney is located on the ridgeline of the rear wing, and is attached to a wood-burning cookstove in the kitchen.

The interior is laid out in a two room, center stair plan with a rear kitchen wing. The staircase is enclosed and the two doorways on either side of the stairs are set at 45 degree angles to the walls. The house rests on a coursed, roughly squared stone foundation that provides a basement to the area under the main block. This basement is used as cold storage. Except for the asphalt siding the house has undergone no alterations. Neither electricity nor plumbing was ever installed. The rooms are lit with kerosene lamps and heated with a wood-burning stove.

A two-room, gable-roofed, vertical plank shed with a porch is located just behind (east) of the house. The privy, which is a frame, gable-roofed building, stands just northeast of this shed. The barn sits on a coursed, squared stone foundation further east. Its frame is constructed of hewn timbers mortise and tenoned together. Shed wings have been added to both long walls and a new roof has been installed. The hog pen, which is located north of the barn, consists of a fenced area and a small, frame shed.


