The Rich Hill School is located immediately north of U.S. Route 48 on the original route of Pig's Ear Road. The road has been rerouted to the east to cross Route 48 via a new bridge.

The school is a one story, gable-roofed building measuring two bays long by one bay wide. The gable-end facade points SE and is covered by a gable-roofed, enclosed storm porch with an entrance door on its NE elevation.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Rich Hill School is located immediately N of U.S. Rt. 48 on the original route of Pig's Ear Road. The road has been rerouted to the E to cross Rt. 48 via a new bridge.

The school is a one story, gable-roofed building measuring two bays long by one bay wide. The gable-end facade points SE and is covered by a gable-roofed, enclosed storm porch with an entrance door on its NE elev.

The school rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with turquoise German siding. The windows are four over four sash with simple cornices and plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with tar paper.

A brick stove chimney rises from the center of the building. The gable-roofed storm porch rests on log piers and is covered with turquoise German siding. On its SW elevation is a two over two sash window. On its NE elevation, above the entrance door, is a wooden, V-shaped rain gutter, resting on two wooden supports which extend from the wall.

The interior of the school is unknown. The building is now a private residence.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to Paul T. Calderwood's "Community Schools of Garrett County" in the Glades Star, the Rich Hill School was designated School #9 in District 5. The school appears on official Board of Education lists as early as 1903. The trustees at that time were Harrison Brown, Jacob E. Bowser, and Amaziah Turney. Also given are the names of the owners of the land on which the school stood. It may have been that the county never owned the school or its land.

Local residents conjecture that the present building was erected no earlier than 1890. According to Scharf, School #9 was known in 1881 as the Schrock School, but this may have been another school.

The school was closed in 1950, and the pupils were bussed to Accident. The teacher at that time was Miss Freda Hone. The construction of U.S. Rt. 48 took the school's spring and playground, but the original road is still intact to several yards S of the schoolhouse.


