DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Pud Miller Farm is located on Pud Miller Road, near Route 219S. The farm is located in a hollow and is surrounded by rolling farmland. The farm consists of a house, barn and several outbuildings.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points SE. The first floor of the facade is covered by a shed-roofed porch and the ell has an enclosed one-story porch.

The house rests on a coursed cut stone foundation and is covered with asphalt shingles over German siding. The windows on the main block are two over two sash and all window surrounds have been obscured. In the ell all windows are three over one sash. The roof is covered with diamond shaped asphalt shingles.

The house has two exterior stove chimneys on the NE elevation of the main block. A newer cinderblock chimney is set forward of the windows, and an older brick chimney is set behind the windows. The facade porch roof is supported by turned posts.

Southeast of the house is a small frame springhouse. The springhouse is covered with vertical boards and the gable roof is covered with vertical boards and the gable roof is covered with corrugated metal. It has a poured concrete foundation. The spring runs SW of the house, into a poured concrete pool and thence into a poured concrete cattle trough. NW of the cattle trough is a concrete block springhouse.

Northwest of the main house are a modern stone garage and outbuilding, and a corncrib. West of the house is a frame bank barn covered with vertical siding. The bank entrance is on the barn's east elevation. SE of the barn is a gable-roofed chickenhouse.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

According to the owner, the main block of the house was built by Newt Geis, a prominent local builder, about a century ago. The owner's father, Pud Miller, bought the property in 1918 and added the rear ell in 1931. This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


