DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The John Kolb Farm is located off Route 219S, approximately a quarter mile north of the town of Accident. The site consists of a house, barn and several small outbuildings and is situated in the midst of open fields.

The house is a two story, gable-roofed structure with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points west. The first floor of the west elevation is covered with an enclosed, shed-roofed porch; the east elevation is covered by a one-story, shed-roofed addition.

The house rests on a coursed stone foundation and is covered on the west, south and second floor of the east elevations with asbestos shingles. The north elevation and first floor of the east elevation are covered with german siding. Most windows are two over two sash; however, there are some one over one sash replacements. All windows have simple cornices and plain board surrounds.

The roof has two cross gables, one on the west and one on the east elevation and the roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has one interior brick stove chimney at the north gable end.

The shed-roofed facade porch is covered with aluminum siding and has modern one over one sash windows. It is roofed with standing seam metal.

Northeast of the house is a small, gable-roofed springhouse. It rests on a stone foundation is covered with brick-patterned asphalt siding over vertical boards, and is roofed in corrugated metal. Northeast of it is another small outbuilding.

Northwest of the house is a large gable-roofed barn with one modern silo and one older brick silo. Several other outbuildings stand near the barn.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is said by the owner to have been built by his great-grandfather, John Kolb, 80-85 years ago. It is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block with a symmetrical three bay facade, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


