DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Owen and Mary Bach House is located on Old Engle Mill Road, just southeast of the Dr. Robert Ravenscroft House (G-II-B-209). The house is set well back from the road.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, T-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points north. A one-story, shed-roofed porch runs the length of the facade and a similar porch fills the T on the south and east elevations.

The house rests on a low stone foundation and is covered with green asbestos shingles. The windows are two over two sash and have simple windowheads and plain board surrounds. On the facade the surrounds are symmetrically moulded. The facade door has a single glass pane in the upper half, surrounded by a carved frame. The lower half of the door is divided into seven panels with raised centers. The four large panels at the top and bottom have sunburst carving.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has one exterior brick stove chimney on its east elevation. The porch roofs are covered with standing seam metal. The facade porch has round columns, and the porch in the T has chamfered posts.

The interior consists of a central staircase with a room on each side, with a kitchen in the T. The staircase was at one time enclosed, but the east wall has been removed.

A modern garage lies south of the house.


