DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Gladys Beitzel House is located on Accident-Friendsville Road, about 1½ miles west of Accident. The house sits close to the road and fields stretch north behind the house.

The house is composed of two, two-story, gable-roofed oblong structures, joined with the ridge lines running parallel. The southern section also has a cross gable at the west end. The facade points south. An enclosed, one-story shed porch covers the facade. A one-story gable-roofed addition extends from the west side of the north elevation and a small, shed-roofed porch covers the north elevation of the main block between the addition and the northeast corner.

The house rests on a hand-cut stone foundation and is covered with red brick-patterned asphalt roll siding. The windows are two over two sash with dripboards and plain board surrounds. The facade door is placed east of center.

The roof is covered with asphalt shingles. The gable on the facade is poured concrete, with bits of broken glass pressed randomly into it. On the east and west gables are plain barge boards ending with jigsaw brackets. The brackets continue on the south and north elevations. At the ridgeline of the cross gable is a decorated terra cotta stove chimney. On the north side of the northern ridgeline is a new interior cinderblock stove chimney.

The one story addition on the north elevation rests on a cinderblock foundation but is otherwise similar to the main block.

The interior of the house is unknown.

There are two outbuildings on the property: one plank-constructed outbuilding immediately north of the house, and a frame outbuilding northeast of the house.
