## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Andy Schlosnagle House is located on the N side of Accident - Bitteringer Road, about .2 miles E of Rt. 219S in the town of Accident. The house is partially screened from the road by trees.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, T-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center door facade. The facade points S. The first floor of the facade is covered with a shed-roofed porch; enclosed one-story, shed-roofed porches fill in the T on the E & W elevations.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with red brick-patterned asphalt roll siding. The windows are one over one sash with plain mitred surrounds. The facade door has a transom. The roof is covered with square and fishscale slate shingles.

The house has two interior brick stove chimneys, one just W of center on the main block and one at the gable end of the T. The facade porch roof is supported by square posts. The plan of interior of the house is unknown. NE of the house is a rectangular, gable-roofed outbuilding covered with German siding.


