DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Frazee - Margraff House is located some way S of Accident - Bittinger Road on the E side of the town of Accident. The house is surrounded by trees, and to the W of the house runs the S Branch of Bear Creek.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, T-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points W. A one-story, shed-roofed porch covers the W, N and half of the E elevations. A small shed-roofed porch fills the T on the SE corner.

The house rests on a high cut stone foundation and is covered with white German siding. The windows are two over two sash; the cornices display jig sawn trim and the surrounds are chamfered. The facade door also has a cornice. The roof is covered with slate shingles and has exposed jig sawn rafter ends.

The house has two interior brick stone chimneys, one at each gable end of the main block. The T and the second floor of the E elevation are covered with green asphalt shingles. The porch roof is supported by chamfered posts and has a balustrade jigsaw in two patterns.

The interior has a center stair case with two rooms on either side. The interior has been thoroughly modernized.

S of the house is a small gable-roofed barn, covered with German siding. SW of the house is a frame garage, also covered with German siding.


