DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This true 1½ story vertical-plank house measures three bays long. A porch covers the east facade, and a vertical-plank shed-roofed addition covers the rear. Two recent additions extending to the north complement the building.

Wood shingles cover the walls of the gabled structure. The building stands on a concrete block foundation. 2/2 windows light the house. An exterior stove-flue chimney appears in the north gable end.

A central entrance opens between the main sections two rooms. A boxed straight-run stair rises from the entry space.

This house is constructed of two layers of vertical planks, the second layer overlapping the cracks of the first layer. A third layer provides additional insulation on the north end.

Frame outbuildings including a bank barn and a chicken house complete the farmstead.

This true 1½ story, vertical-plank house faces east. The three-bay main block is augmented by a rear shed-roofed kitchen.
