The Thistle-Miller-Bender farm is a two-story frame farmhouse with five bays on its north facade, and three at the rear. The two-bay deep house includes porches covering the facade and rear. A central entrance opens into either side.

Insul-brick covers the original wooden siding. The building's foundation and cellar are constructed of stone. A spring is located under the front porch. A stuccoed frame tenant house stands south of the main dwelling.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Thistle-Miller-Bender farm is located on a plateau approximately halfway to the summit of Negro Mountain as it rises from Shade Hollow, west of Grantsville.

The two-story frame farmhouse presents five bays on its north facade, and three at the rear. The two-bay deep house includes porches covering the facade and rear. A central entrance opens into either side.

Two over two sash windows light the house. Two four-pane windows light either side of the attic. The cellar is exposed on the south, where a central entrance is flanked by a window to either side. A brick stove-flue chimney heats either gable end. Corrugated metal covers the roof. Insul-brick covers the original wooden siding. The building's foundation and cellar are constructed of stone.

The floor plan consists of a central stair with two rooms to either side. The rooms are divided by wide beaded board partitions. In a closet the originally exposed chamfered joists are visible. 3" by 4" studs frame the walls.

A spring located under the front porch is reached through the cellar.

A stuccoed frame tenant house stands south of the main dwelling. The two story, two bay square house has a hipped roof and a central brick stove-flue chimney.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house was built in 1849 by Henry Miller, a Mennonite from the German settlement at Springs, PA., north of Grantsville. The house faces the old Braddock Road to the north, about 500 yards south of the National Road. The spring at this house is believed to be the White Oak Spring at which Joseph Mount's late 18th century cabin was located. George Washington recorded a breakfast at Mount's cabin in 1784 in his journal.


