DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This plank farmhouse is situated in a hilly area on Zehner Road approximately 1½ miles north of Rt. 40. The house faces east. The house is a two story, three bay by one bay, plank constructed structure with a gable roof that slopes downward on the back to form a single story, two bay by two bay rear section. A wooden porch, supported by plain square posts, extends the length of the facade. The house is entered from the central facade entrance and from an entrance at the south elevation where the rear section meets the main block.

The house has a central brick chimney. Two over two sash windows, framed with plain flat boards, light the house, There are no windows in the second story facade. Four pane windows appear in the half story of the rear section at the south and north elevations. The cellar entrance is located under the facade porch where, because of the placement of the house on the hill, it is entered at ground level. The house rests on a cut stone block foundation. Weathered vertical planks cover the exterior with raised seamed metal on the roof.

A small log barn stands east of the house.


