DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a hilly area on Dorsey Hotel Road approximately 2 miles north of Grantsville and Rt. 40. The house faces east. It is a two story, three-bay by two-bay gable roof structure with a two-bay by one-bay ell. A single story, square addition is located at the corner of the rear, west, elevation of the house and one ell. A single story shed addition runs along the facade and continues around the south elevation of the house. A screened-in porch is located at the north elevation.

The house can be entered from the central facade, the west elevation of the side extension of the facade addition and from the north elevation porch.

Exterior brick chimneys are located at the south elevation of the main block and the rear, west, elevation of the ell. The house is lit predominantly by 2/2 sash windows.

The cellar is entered under the facade addition. The house is covered with asbestos shingles with corrugated metal on the roof.

A small single-story frame structure with a bell tower is located west of the house.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late 19th through the early 20th centuries.

This farm is said to have been built by D. J. Schwartzentruber in the late 19th century.


