The Ross House, located at 44 Railroad Street, Grantsville (Jennings), Garrett County, MD is not located in an historic district nor is it considered eligible for individual listing on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Ross House is a two story I house built between 1890 and 1930. The aluminum covered frame structure sits on a concrete foundation and is covered with a low gable roof. The windows are 1 over 1 and the door is in the center of the south facade. A shed roof porch with wrought iron supports and railing projects from the front of the main facade. At the rear are two other additions, both 1-1/2 stories, aluminum covered and with gable roofs.

The dwelling is typical of the domestic architecture of the period and lacks the architectural distinctiveness to qualify for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C. The property is not known to have any associations with persons or events significant to our past and is thus not eligible under Criteria A or B.




