A vertical-plank farmhouse, a vertical-plank hired hand's house, a log springhouse, several sheds, and a frame bank barn make up this farm. The farm is set on slightly rolling land about $\frac{1}{4}$ mile west of the Youghioghney River. This is a typical, but especially complete and well-detailed, Garrett County farm. The springhouse is one of the best-preserved of its type in the county.

The log house was located east of the present farmstead, just below the crest of the hill on its downward slope to the Youghioghney River.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

A vertical plank farmhouse, a vertical-plank hired hand's house, a log springhouse, several sheds, and a frame bank barn make up this farm. The farm is set on slightly rolling land about ¼ mile west of the Youghiogheny River.

The two-story, L-shaped farmhouse, built in 1900, faces north. The main block measures three bays wide by one bay deep. A shed-roofed porch covers the facade. The entrance occupies the center bay, while the bay above is unfenestrated. 2/2 sash windows light the house. A single-pane window appears in either gable end of the attic. Plain board architraves capped by a drip molding frame the windows and door.

A central brick stove-flue chimney heats the house. Tarpaper covers the gable roof. The house is sheathed in German siding and stands on a stone foundation. Chamfered posts and semi-circular jigsaw brackets distinguish the porch. Half-circle blocks with cut-out centers decorate the exposed rafter feet on the porch. The interior molding features a convex center followed by a half-round and a fillet to either side. A three-bay by one-bay kitchen ell was added to the west end of the south side in about 1915, according to the owner. A hip-roofed porch covers the west side. A central entrance appears under an unfenestrated bay. Exterior materials and finishes match those on the main block.

A two-story shed-roofed frame addition fills the southeast corner of the "L." This German-sided section appears to date from the second quarter of the 20th century.

The floor plan of the main block consists of two rooms. The larger west room contains the stair, turning in the southwest corner. The kitchen includes one large room to the north, and a smaller room to the south. A central brick stove-flue chimney rises between the two rooms.

The true-1½-story tenant house stands c. 50 yards east of the main house. The two-bay facade faces north. The gable-roofed structure measures one bay deep. A four-panel door occupies the west bay on the facade. Other bays contain 2/2 sash windows framed in plain flat boards. A shed-roofed porch displaying "pole" posts crosses the facade. A brick stove-flue chimney rises from the center of the tenant house. Standing-seam metal covers the roof, and German siding covers the walls. The building stands on stone piers. Rafter feet are exposed at the eaves.

A one-story log springhouse stands c. 100 yards southwest of the farmhouse. The building was moved several years ago by the present owner from an earlier house site near the river to the east. It appears to have been moved intact.

The gable roof runs north-south. The springhouse measures approximately 8' x 12'. The spring runs, and the land slopes, from north to south. A simple dry-laid stone shelter covers the spring itself, which is located outside the springhouse to the north. Several steps lead downhill from east to west to the outside entrance area between the spring and the springhouse. A pent roof cantilevered from the north gable end of the springhouse protects this area. The building's entrance in this end is framed in plain flat boards. To the left and partly above the door there is a shuttered opening leading to an interior storage box. A single-pane northern window, framed in plain flat boards, runs horizontally, requiring that only small sections be cut out of two logs.

The V-notched logs were originally whitewashed. They are chinked with narrow boards and daubed with clay mortar. Corrugated sheet-metal covers the roof.


A hewn summer beam runs through the center of the building, protruding at either end. The log plate extends to form a cantilevered support for the pent roof. This plate is rounded on the underside and V-shaped along the top. The rafters are notched over the plate, resembling rafters notched over a tilted false plate.

The earlier log house, which the springhouse served, was torn down in the first half of the twentieth century and many of the logs were used in building this farm's present barn. This building and other outbuildings were not inspected.



Facade NE elev.






