DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Lafayette Uphold House is located several feet E of Trap Run Road, approximately .9 mile above its junction with White Rock Road. The area is one of rolling farmland. Just E of the house is a modern farmhouse.

The house is a true one and ½-story, gable-roofed dwelling measuring two bays across the facade (SE elevation) and one bay on the gable ends. A one-story, shed-roofed porch stretches the length of the facade.

The house rests on stone footings and the plank-constructed walls are covered with black tarpaper. The first floor windows are two over two sash with plain board surrounds. The second floor windows are two panes placed side by side. The facade contains two doors, one in each bay.

The roof is covered with flat metal. The house has no chimney or flues of any kind. The porch roof is covered with tarpaper and is supported by seven square wooden posts.

The first floor of the interior consists of two rooms with a connecting door. A corner stair rises on the NW & SW walls.

Northeast of the house is a small gable-roofed springhouse. Its entrance points SE & the spring emerges immediately facing the springhouse door. Behind (NW) of the springhouse is a watering trough.

Southwest of the house is a two-story, gable-roofed outbuilding with a shed addition attached at the NW elevation. The building is covered with tarpaper and has two over two sash windows.

Farther to the SW is a gable-roofed frame barn covered with vertical siding.

The house is unoccupied and all buildings are in dilapidated condition.


