## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This frame house is situated in a relatively flat area northeast of Ginseng Hill and faces southwest. It is a two-story, three-bay by two-bay structure with a two-bay deep ell. Both wings have hipped roofs. A porch extends across the facade. An enclosed porch, single story addition extends across the northwest elevation of the ell.

The house can be entered by the facade's central entrance, the northwest porch addition, and from the southeast rear.

1/1 sash modern windows light the house, with 3/1 windows in the porch addition.

The house rests on a concrete covered foundation. The cellar is entered from a small enclosure on the northwest elevation, toward the facade of the house. The house is covered with aluminum siding. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

Attached to the rear of the house is a small story-and-a-half, one-bay by one-bay rectangular frame structure with a gable roof. The structure rests on a stone foundation and is covered on the southeast and northwest elevations with asphalt shingles and on the northeast elevation with German siding. The roof is covered with seamed metal sheets.


