DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The George B. Stoltzfus House is located on a private drive approximately .1 mile N off of Friendsville-Hoyes Road. The drive entrance is approximately .1 mile SE of Gap Run Road. The land around the house is flat but behind (N) of the house the land slopes down to Stony Brook.

The house is a two-story gable-roofed dwelling measuring three bays across the facade and two bays on the side elevations. The facade points SW. A one-story, hipped-roof porch covers the facade and the SE elevation. The porch has been enclosed from the center of the SE elevation to the rear (NE elevation). At the NW end of the NE elevation is a new wood deck.

The house rests on a poured concrete foundation and is covered with white asbestos shingle. All windows are one over one with simple cornices and plain board surrounds. The entrance door is in the central bay of the facade but is offset to the SE. The door has a beveled glass panel and the door is decorated with carved scrolls. The door has a rectangular transom.

The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and has a central cross gable on the facade. The house has one interior chimney set NW of center. The porch is supported by seven Roman Doric columns.

The interior is unknown.

To the E of the house is a one story, gable-roofed outbuilding covered with vertical boards. To the S is a large frame bank barn with silo and several concrete block outbuildings. The barn has a gable roof covered with corrugated metal and walls covered with vertical boards.

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block measuring 3 bays on the facade were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.


