DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The John Doerr House is located on the N side of Milt deWitt Road, about .8 miles E of Friendsville-Hoyes Road and about 1.6 miles N of Hoyes. The house rests on clear farmland.

The house is a two story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The W elevation of the main block measures two bays; the E elevation, one bay. The ell measures two bays on the E elevation and one on all the others. A one-story shed porch runs the length of the facade and another partly fills the ell on the N and E elevations. The facade points South.

The main block of the house rests on a low cut stone foundation. The ell rests on a foundation of poured concrete. The walls are covered with red brick-patterned asphalt roll siding. The windows are all two over two sash with cornices and plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with corrugated metal.

The house has one interior chimney on the east side of the ell. The facade porch is supported by cinderblock piers. The west end of the porch has been closed in to make an extra room. The east end of the porch roof is supported by chamfered wooden posts. The ell porch has been closed in by storm windows and wall board. Both porch roofs are covered with corrugated metal.

The interior is unknown. A frame barn is located NE of the house.


