The Beachy-Beitzell Farm consists of a house and large modern barn. The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade.

This farm is the site of the Beachy home place. The Beachy family at one time owned land comprising over 1000 acres, including the land where the sites G-III-B-086 and 085 now stand. The modern barn on the property uses the cut stone foundation which was laid by Jonas J. Beachy in 1848 for what was then the largest barn in the area. The wooden portions of the barn burned recently and the foundation was reused for the large modern structure.

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Beachy-Beitzell Farm is located S off Rock Lodge Road, down a dirt drive. The farm consists of a house and large modern barn, and is surrounded by fields.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points E and is covered by a one-story, gable-roofed porch. The W elevation is covered with a two-story, shed-roofed addition. The ground falls from E to W, creating a full basement story on the W elevation.

The house rests on a rubble stone foundation and is covered with green asphalt-siding over weatherboarding. The windows are new one over one sash with angled mouldings and plain board surrounds. The facade door is offset to the S and has a transom. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The house has one exterior brick stone chimney on the N elevation. The porch roof is covered with asphalt shingles and is supported by chamfered posts.

The house has a central staircase but the interior is otherwise unknown. N of the house is a large modern barn resting on an old cut stone foundation.
