DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jack Beitzell House is located on Accident - Bittinger Road, about a half mile W of Foxtown Road. The house is positioned on rising ground and is surrounded by fields.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center door facade. The facade points SE. One story, shed-roofed porches cover the facade and NW elevations. The ground rises from SE to NW, creating a full basement story on the facade.

The house rests on a cut, coursed stone foundation and is covered with German siding. All windows are two over two sash with drip moldings and plain board surrounds. The facade door has a transom.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has one interior brick stove chimney placed SW of center at the ridgeline. The porch roofs are covered with corrugated metal and are supported by turned posts. The facade porch has a balustrade of plain square posts.

The interior arrangement of the house is unknown. The site includes a frame bank barn, placed W of the barn.
