**DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE**

Meadow Mountain Farm is located on Accident-Bittinger Road, about a half mile N of Aiken-Miller Road. The farm consists of a house, a log springhouse, a barn and several farm buildings. The farm is surrounded by fields.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling built of logs, with a four-bay, facade. The facade points E. The ground falls steeply from W to E, creating a full basement story on the facade. A shed-roofed porch covers the first floor of the facade, while a full, two-story addition covers the W elevation.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with aluminum siding over weatherboarding. The windows are two over two sash, and all surrounds have been obscured. The facade door is positioned between the northernmost and central windows.

The roof is covered with fishscale and square-shaped shingles. The house has two interior brick stove chimneys: one at the center of the house and one at the N gable end. The facade porch roof is covered with corrugated metal and is supported by chamfered posts. The interior arrangement of the house is unknown.

N of the house is a one-story, gable-roofed springhouse built of logs on a stone foundation. The logs are V-notched and are daubed with cement. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles and has a gable-roofed bell tower at the E gable end. The entrance door is on the E gable end. The interior is one room with a stone trough on the S wall. The roof is supported by sapling rafters.

SW of the springhouse is the spring, covered with a concrete hood. N of the springhouse are several frame farm buildings and a frame bank barn. The barn rests on a concrete block foundation and is covered with vertical boards. The bank entrance faces NW.


