## DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Four Seasons Camp Ranch is located W off Accident-Bittering Road, about a quarter mile S of Aiken-Miller Road. The site includes a house, barn and several small farm buildings.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points NE and its first floor is covered by a hipped-roofed porch. The SW elevation has a one-story, shed-roofed addition.

The house rests on a cut squared stone foundation and is covered with grey asphalt roll siding. The windows are two over two and two over one sash with simple mitred surrounds. The facade has a single-paned transom.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has one interior brick stove chimney at the NW gable end. The facade porch roof is covered with standing-seam metal and is supported by chamfered posts. The interior arrangement of the house is unknown.

NW of the house is a frame bank barn with a silo attached to its SW elevation. The bank entrance faces SW and the barn is covered with vertical boards and corrugated metal.

Off the S corner of the house is a small storage building and E of the house is a small frame farm building.
