DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Aiken-Miller Road School is located on the S side of Aiken-Miller Road, near its intersection with Accident-Bittinger Road. The school is screened from the road by tall bushes.

The school is a one-story, gable-roofed building measuring one bay across the gable end by two bays. The facade points SE and the original door has been enlarged to garage door size.

The school rests on a low stone foundation and the stud walls are covered with German siding. The windows are three over six sash and the lights are filled with cylinder glass. Scars on the walls indicate that the windows were once taller. The NW gable end has a four-panel door. The roof is covered with tar paper.

On the interior of the building, the floor has been removed, revealing a shallow-stone-lined depression. Part of the interior horizontal board wall covering remains, revealing painted wainscoting of dark red with cream above. The boards are attached with cut nails. On either side of the NW door are shadows on the walls which may indicate former position of blackboards.

The school is abandoned and in extremely poor condition.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Simon J. Martinet Map of Garrett County of 1886 indicates a school at this location, but it is not certain which of nine schools in Accident District, No. 5, this is. Its general configuration is typical of one-room schoolhouses of this period; however, this school was later turned into a machine shop and is now in very poor condition. A better example of this type is G-II-A-046, Asher Glade School.
