DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Earl Knox House II is located on the east side of Aiken-Miller Road, about a half mile north of Accident-Bittinger Road. A driveway runs south of the house.

The house is a one and one half story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points northeast and its first floor is covered by a shed-roofed porch. A shed-roofed kitchen wing is attached to the southwest elevation and a shed-roofed addition is attached to the southeast elevation.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and is covered with green asphalt shingles over weather boarding. The weatherboarding is still visible under the facade porch. The walls are in the process of being covered with stone. The windows are 2/2 sash, with plain board surrounds. The roof is covered with asphalt shingles.

The house has one exterior brick stove chimney on the southwest elevation of the kitchen wing. The porch roof is covered with tar paper and is supported by chamfered posts. The interior of the house features an enclosed staircase but is otherwise unknown.
