DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Silber House is located at the junction of Spear and Bumblebee Roads, just east of US rt. 219S. The site is wooded and includes several outbuildings.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points SW and its first floor is covered by a hipped-roofed porch. The ell is filled on the SE elevation by a one-story, shed-roofed sunporch.

The house rests on a cut stone foundation and the plank-constructed walls are covered with asbestos shingles over weatherboarding. The windows are two over two sash with plain mitred surrounds. The roof has a box cornice and is covered with slate shingles.

The house has one interior brick stove chimney near the NW gable end of the main block. The facade porch roof is covered with slate shingles and is supported by wooden columns.

The the north and east of the house are several frame outbuildings. To the northeast is a frame barn.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is an example of a common western Maryland type. Houses of this general configuration, a rectangular main block and rear kitchen wing, were constructed in Garrett County from the late nineteenth through the early twentieth centuries.

The land owned by the Silbers comprises most of the 200 acres given in four 50-acre military lots to a Captain West just after the Revolutionary War. Captain West built a tobacco barn on the land with the intention of using slave labor to raise tobacco, but was only successful for a short term. The barn has long since disappeared.
