Description of Property and Eligibility Determination: (Use continuation sheet if necessary and attach map and photo)

This house, built c. 1900, is a one and one-half story dwelling with a side gabled roof, which is covered with composition shingles on the northwest side of the roof and standing seam metal on the southeast. Constructed of wood frame, this building rests on a stone foundation. Importantly for an evaluation of overall integrity, the majority of its original wood windows have been replaced with aluminum frame windows, and its exterior wall covering has been replaced with aluminum siding. Furthermore, an addition has been made to the south façade, which alters the historic footprint of the house.

The Jack Alexander house was previously assessed for National Register eligibility. The MHT, in a letter dated June 7, 1990, rendered its opinion that this property was not eligible for listing for the National Register. Having recently visited the historic property, it is my opinion that the Jack Alexander House continues to lack the architectural integrity necessary for a property to achieve eligibility for listing in the National Register.



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Jack Alexander House is located on the east side of Bumblebee Road, about a quarter mile S of Negro Mountain Road. The house is set back from the road and is backed by a garden and trees.

The house is a true one and a half story, gable-roofed dwelling with a three-bay, center-door facade. The facade points NW and its first story is covered with a shed-roofed porch. A shed-roofed extension covers the SW elevation and a one-story kitchen section covers the rear (SE elevation), creating a catslide roof.

The house rests on a stone foundation and the plank-constructed walls are covered with aluminum siding. The windows on the first floor are sash, with varying numbers of lights. The half-story windows tilt vertically.

The roof is covered with corrugated metal. The house has two brick stove chimneys: one exterior chimney on the SE elevation and a central interior chimney. The porch roof is covered with asphalt shingles and is supported by square posts.

The interior arrangement includes a central, open staircase with a room on either side. The site includes several frame outbuildings.
