DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Otto Goehringer Farm is located west of Rt 219S, just south of the town of Accident. The farm stands high on a hill, overlooking the highway and consists of a house and barn.

The house is a two-story, gable-roofed, ell-plan dwelling with a symmetrical, two-bay facade. The facade points southeast and its first floor is covered with a hipped-roofed porch. On the northeast elevation, the ell is filled with a one-story, enclosed, shed-roofed porch.

The house rests on a low stone foundation and is covered with aluminum siding over German siding. The windows are 2/2 sash with mitred surrounds. The facade door, in the east bay of the facade, has two glass panels in its upper half.

The roof is slate. The house has two stove chimneys: an interior brick chimney at the southwest gable end of the main block, and an exterior cinderblock chimney on the northeast gable end of the main block. The facade porch has an asphalt roof supported by square posts.

Southwest of the house is a small gable-roofed board and batten garage, and southeast of the garage is a frame bank barn. The bank entrance points northwest. The barn has a stone foundation, vertical board-covered walls painted red, and a corrugated metal roof. On either gable end are painted two white five-pointed stars.
