DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Between 1936 and 1938, the Work Projects Administration constructed twenty-four buildings on this Pleasant Valley tract near Cunningham Lake. Most of these structures are seasonal facilities, in use as campsites from the last week in April to the first of October every year. In conjunction with this building project, the WPA constructed in addition, a dam and roadway.

The state 4-H organization uses these buildings which are situated on a 1,200-acre tract owned by the University of Maryland.

The cabins are frame-constructed; the lumber employed is local chestnut. They are sheathed in lap-siding, and painted with dark brown creosote finish. According to the caretaker, they remain in good, serviceable condition.

RECOMMENDATIONS: MARYLAND AGRICULTURAL EXPERIMENT STATION

The following buildings or properties which are part of the Maryland Agricultural Experiment Station, have been judged historically and architecturally significant and as such, have been added to the Maryland Inventory of Historic Sites:

- 1) Cherry Hill Plant Research Farm
2000 Cherry Hill Road
Silver Spring, Maryland 20904
- 2) Otten Horse Farm
Route 175, Waterloo Road
Ellicott City, Maryland 21043
- 3) Pleasant Valley Recreation Center
Cunningham Lake
Garrett County, Maryland.

Regarding the Cherry Hill complex, if the University decides to sell the property, the Trust recommends locating a buyer who will adaptively reuse these WPA-constructed buildings under provisions of a protective preservation easement.

The Otten farmhouse should be maintained in its present context within the University Experimental Farm system.

The Pleasant Valley 4-H complex in Garrett County should continue in its present situation of seasonal usage.

A comprehensive archeological survey should be initiated immediately to comply with the 1978 Board of Public Works Policy Statement. Areas that require particular attention in below-ground investigation include: the Clarksville Central Farm facility; the Sharpsburg tract; and the University of Maryland campus in Baltimore County where many nineteenth century and one late eighteenth century stone farmhouses have disappeared since the early 1960's.
